

Easter Celebrates Christ is Risen!

Our Lenten Journey of Covenant continues through the first week of April as we journey toward the dramatic moments of Holy Week – Jesus' last days before his death and resurrection. These last days of Lent are precious and help prepare us for the wonder and meaning of Easter. Each event provides a special insight and spiritual connection to the great sacrifice Jesus made for the salvation of the world. We invite you to continue the journey all the way to the Empty Tomb.

At the beginning of April, there is a shift of emphasis.

Whereas our focus in March was on hunger, in April we direct our thoughts upon our spiritual thirst for God, as well as the thirst for clean drinking water in our world today! As part of our Lent projects, we will collect a 4 week Noisy Offerings that will be used for a "water filtration system" for an elementary school in Rakai, Uganda.

HOLY WEEK CELEBRATION

Holy Week begins on Saturday, March 31st and Sunday, April 1st as we celebrate Palm Sunday. Palm branches will be distributed prior to worship which will add to the festive celebration of Jesus' triumphal entrance into Jerusalem. The Grace Music Ministries Team will present: HERE IS OUR KING – *A Musical Journey of the Passion of Lord* at all worship services this weekend.

Maundy Thursday, April 5th, will be celebrated in a unique and meaningful way this year. The service will be a special dramatic "living" presentation of the "Last Supper." The Grace Contemporary Worship Team will provide a beautiful, musical setting and live staging of one of the most important events of Holy Week...Jesus celebrating with his disciples in the Upper Room, for one last meal. The service will conclude with a dramatic moment in the Garden of Gethsemane.

On Good Friday, April 6th we will gather at 7:00 p.m. for the "THE STATIONS OF THE CROSS". The service follows Jesus last journey of love...the journey to the cross through dramatic readings, beautiful artwork, and reflective music.

EASTER CELEBRATION

Grace will offer many opportunities to celebrate the Victory of the Empty Tomb on Easter weekend. We will begin our celebration at the Easter Vigil Service on Saturday, April 7th at 5:00 p.m. This service has a special "flavor" of celebrating both Good Friday and Easter morning with readings from the Old Testament, and include stories of rescue and salvation as a backdrop to celebrate new life through Jesus' resurrection. This service will continue the wonderful atmosphere and feel of our Lent Vespers Services. Easter morning will offer four celebration services on April 8th. Special music and inspiring worship will be offered at all of our services. Please come and share where hope comes to life at Jesus' empty tomb!

Pastor Mark's Remarks:



When It's Impossible to Hear the Good News...

I haven't been able to stop thinking about the

passage from our Daily Lent Journal concerning the inability of the people of God to believe the good news that God was going to free them from captivity. It was the reading for Tuesday, March 13 – Exodus 6:1-9. As I read it, I found myself hardly able to breath. It was these words that struck me as so sad:

Moses told this to the Israelites; but they would not listen to Moses, because of their *broken* spirit and their cruel slavery. (Ex. 6:9)

What a terrible tragedy! Here was Moses bringing the greatest news to these poor slaves! God was about to act in a mighty way. He was about to give them land in Canaan. He was going to deliver them from slavery AND he was going to "take them as his personal people." All this good news; yet, the people were unable to hear these promises. Discouraged, beaten down in spirit, and hopeless, they could not dare to believe the good news.

I found myself wondering if this has been a problem in my life, or in the lives of any of us who call Grace our spiritual home. Have there been times when I have been so discouraged, broken, and depressed that I haven't been able to comprehend the good things God desires to bring in my life? Have there been difficult seasons in the life of Grace when situations have sucked the hope and abundance God has showered upon us, away? Could I...could we suffer from the same problem as the Israelites did when they could not hear the good news Moses brought to them?

As I have journeyed this Lent, it seems that these feelings feel "right" and "normal" for people who are just about ready to experience the events of Holy

Week. For in a just a little while, we will retell the familiar stories of Jesus' last week of life. And as we do, we anticipate the disciples' raw emotions and terrible shock as they witnessed the betrayal, sufferings, and brutal execution of Jesus.

Even though we've heard it many times, we will see them devastated, broken, and so discouraged. And after seeing such terrible things, they will hardly be in any position to hear the good news of the empty tomb. For they were just like the Israelites – too broken and discouraged to even comprehend the angels' good news! Would we be any different?

I am so thankful God doesn't wait until we're able to hear the good news to act! I am so grateful he is constantly in our lives, bringing healing, forgiveness, salvation, and new life, regardless of whether we're in the right frame of mind to see it, hear it, and/or experience it! That's the good news of the Empty Tomb! God did not wait until the broken disciples were ready to accept that Jesus had risen from the dead! And God doesn't wait until we're ready, to bring new life to us! He just does it!

Isn't this good news as we wait to gather on Easter morning? No matter what the situation or circumstance in our lives, God is bringing hope, rescue, freedom, and new life. How reassuring that it took a while for the Israelites to grasp their hope. How comforting it is to know that it took the disciples a while to comprehend the miracle of Jesus' resurrection. And perhaps, it will take us a while to see what God is doing in our own lives. But perhaps not; for you see, we've already been to the Empty Tomb and we know what God is about! He's bringing new life and hope and salvation to you, me, and to his world!

certainties of our childhood no longer make sense to us, and these changes are coming at such a fast pace it can feel as if our lives are in constant chaos. Many historians believe that we haven't seen change of this magnitude since Martin Luther and the Reformation.

None of our forbearers had access to knowledge and opportunity in the way that we do today, and none of our forbearers were faced with the ominous truth that some of the simplest choices we make today will have a major impact for generations to come. These endless choices that we face on a daily basis can paralyze us. Too often we are left feeling exhausted and hopeless about any difference we might make.

This new world requires a redefining of who we are and what we are called to be, in this time and place in history. It demands a redefining of our relationship with God, with each other, to the global community and to the earth itself. Though it can feel overwhelming and frightening, it is also an undeniably exciting and promising time in human history.

The week after Easter, we will begin to explore what it means for us to be God's stewards in this new world.

Over the course of four weeks we will be asking the question "What difference does it make?"

- What difference does it make that we call ourselves Christian in this new world?
- What difference does it make that God is relying on us to bring a word of hope and love for all people?
- What difference does it make when we understand that we do not own our time, our unique talents, or any of our money and possessions, but that they belong to God who has entrusted us with their use for the sake of the world?

Together we will celebrate all the amazing ways the people of Grace are already making a difference, and take time to consider the joy and possibilities still waiting for us! I hope you will make it a priority to join in "the question" as we seek to live as God's people in this new world!

A Note from the Church Administrator

It's hard to believe that we are nearing the end of the first quarter of 2012! Our annual school spring

break is over, the kids are back in school, and we have enjoyed the early arrival of Spring! The Property Team, custodians, and many others have been busy preparing our facility for the Holy Week events. As we take time to reflect upon this first quarter of ministry at Grace, we give thanks to God for the ways in which we are allowed to be a part of His ministry in the heart of Andover.

During the first quarter, we have also been reviewing our contracts with several vendors. Through this effort we have been able to reduce our administrative costs by almost \$3,000 for the remainder of the year.

As a staff, we have worked to be fiscally responsible with the gifts we have received. Here are a couple of highlights that we have obtained related to the 2012 forecasted Missional budget:

- We have increased our Benevolence by 0.5%.
- We have continued to make payments towards the remaining \$6,000 owed to the Capital Fund.
- We have continued to make minor improvements to the computer environment.

While we made great strides in 2011 towards our Capital giving, we have struggled in our ability to build contributions to fully fund the monthly mortgage of \$10,066. In January and February, we averaged a \$2,300 short fall each month. We are still current in our mortgage payments, but this has resulted in a reduction of the Capital Fund balance.

Following our Easter Celebration in April, we will begin our Stewardship Sermon Series in order to bolster the spiritual growth that was initiated through the "Keep It Simple" Campaign in 2011. We look forward to sharing with you what a difference stewardship can make to each person, the community, the world, and God. Thank you for all you do to keep the ministry of Grace moving forward in the heart of Andover.



Family Promise is coming to Grace!

Grace will host Family Promise the week of May 13-20, 2012. Our church family will provide warm hospitality and safe shelter for families that have found themselves without a home or place to stay. And we will provide training for all volunteers who would like to be involved in this ministry.

What Is It? Family Promise of Anoka County (FPAC) is a network of 15 congregations who provide temporary housing to families without homes. Guests are housed at each host congregation for one week on a rotating basis, moving to a new location in the network each week until they are able to become self-sufficient. Grace will provide lodging, meals and caring hospitality 4-5 weeks each year.

How Does It Work? The FPAC van transports guests to Grace each evening for dinner and an overnight stay at the church. After breakfast, families are returned to the Day Center on Coon Rapids Blvd. From there the children can go to school, and parents can go to work, or use the resources at the center to seek employment, shower, and do laundry.

How Can I Help? Everyone can participate: children, teens, adults and seniors.

- Prepare an evening meal for 16 people
- Serve the meal and clean up the kitchen (5 - 7:30 pm)
- Provide overnight security at the church (8:30 pm – 7 am)
- Be an Evening Host chat with guests, play games, help with homework, etc. (5 – 9 pm)
- Set up rooms for our guests, then take down beds the following Sunday.
- Donate food supplies such as milk, juice, bread, lunchmeat, fruit and snacks.
- Transport guests in the FPAC van (either at 7 am or 5 pm)



Haiti Mission Trip Update



You may have heard that we have 17 people who are planning to head to Haiti in July of this year. We are traveling with World Wide Village. Recently our group met with Randy and Pat Morten-

son, the president and administrative director of the organization. They helped give us a flavor of the experience, skills needed and project ideas that we could accomplish in our time there.

As a group we settled on two projects we hope to complete during our visit. The first is to build a playground for a school in the town of Luly. World Wide Village has already built the Christian school in Luly and it currently serves 340 children. Right now, these children don't have any playground equipment at all, and simply play in the dirt outside of the school. Our other goal is to help build a community garden in the neighboring community of Williamson. World Wide Village has already built a community garden for 30 families in Luly and it has been a great success. Those gardens provide fresh fruit and vegetables for the families in that community, as well as an income for them as they sell the excess produce. The success of that project has attracted the attention of families in Williamson, and they have been asking for the same type of project in their community. We won't be able to provide enough gardens for another 30 families, but we are hoping to be able to raise enough funds so that we can provide gardens for 10 families.

As a team, we are extremely excited about this trip. We will spend at least one day distributing "Feed My Starving Children" food, and the remainder of our time working on projects. We are excited about the possibility of providing a playground for the children and gardens for the families.

If we could achieve all of these things during our short time there, we would consider our trip to be a great success and feel as though we acted as the "hands and feet of Christ".

In order to accomplish all of these projects we need to raise funds. The total cost of the two projects is \$16,000. To date we have already raised about \$5,000. So now, we are trying to raise the remaining funds so that we can accomplish everything we are trying to do.

We are also raising funds for Creole Bibles. It was especially shocking to learn that Bibles were not only in great need for the Haitian people, but that even Pastors rarely have their own Bible! Creole Bibles can be purchased in Haiti for \$10. If you would specifically like to donate a Bible, we would be happy to write your name, or a dedication to a loved one in the front of the Bible after we purchase them.




Thank You Grace:
