No Turning Back!



“No one who puts a hand to the plow and looks back, is fit for the kingdom of God.”

Grace’s Lenten Journey begins on Ash Wednesday, February 13th as we start our 40 day journey to the cross of Good Friday, and the empty tomb of Easter. At the heart of our Lenten journey is a call for us to follow Jesus in deep and authentic ways; yet we often find our intentions are not so easily connected to our follow through. Like many, would be disciples who came to Jesus with the best intentions and said: “I will follow you wherever you go,” we find that many things get in the way. When that happens, we are tempted to turn back.

This is why we begin on Ash Wednesday with repentance. We admit we often turn back from following Jesus, or give in to self-centeredness and pursue the wrong things. To publically admit our shallow commitment to follow Jesus, ashes are marked on our foreheads and words are spoken: “Remember that you are dust and to dust you shall return.” It is the time we seek to hear again, God’s righteousness, forgiveness, and love.

Lent is a long journey. It is a 40 day period of spiritual investment. During this journey, we set aside time for deeper moments of prayer, worship, fasting, acts of charity, scriptural meditation and Bible reading...all meant to help us step away from those things that hinder us in our spiritual journeys, as well as prepare us for the celebration of our Lord’s Resurrection on Easter.

In order for us to reflect upon the ways we are tempted to “turn back”, our weekend worship services will focus upon some meaningful parables Jesus taught his disciples: The Good Samaritan,” “The Fig Tree,” The Lost Coin,” “The Prodigal Son,” and The Rich Man and Lazarus.” All of these parables will help us reflect upon God’s forgiveness, grace, and call to live deeper as Jesus’ disciples.

In addition to our weekend worship, a 7:00pm Wednesday Evening Lenten Service will be offered each week. We will watch a powerful Video Series entitled “**On Our Way: Conversations about Christian Practices for Living a Whole Life.**” Taught by some of today’s most passionate and intentional disciples of Jesus.

In order to deepen our Lenten journey, we are asking everyone at Grace to consider the follow:

- * Make Weekend Worship and Wednesday Vespers services a high priority.
- * Join us for “Lenten Suppers” on Wednesday nights at 5:30pm from February 20-March 20. This is a time of fellowship and community around a simple meal, as various Grace ministries prepare and serve the meal each week.
- * Use the daily Bible readings in the Grace Lenten Brochure which is available at the Welcome Center in the Lobby or on our website.

We invite you to the Journey...the journey where there is no turning back from the love and forgiveness of God, shown to us at the cross of Jesus. May this be a time to be challenged! May it be a journey when we are assured of God’s forgiveness and love. But most of all, may it be a time for us to deepen and follow Jesus to the cross of Good Friday and the empty tomb of Easter morning.

Pastor Mark's Remarks:



Will You Be Happy This Year?

All I need to be happy is \$162,000! That's what a recent article in the Minneapolis Star Tribune reported! Apparently Skandia International, a British firm specializing in offshore investment solutions developed a "wealth sentiment monitor," which asked 5,000 people in 13 countries how much money they needed to feel happy. And the average answer was \$162,000 (in U.S. Dollars).

I was eager to learn more, so I continued to read how the company determined the "happiness level."

The figure dipped to \$85,781 for ever-stoic Germans to a high of \$276,150 from Dubai residents, who presumably are otherwise melancholic.

The survey also went a step further, asking how much money it would take to feel wealthy. In a word....more.

Citizens of Singapore said they'd need \$2.91 million to feel wealthy, while Americans low-balled the feeling at \$1 million. (from the Variety h+g E section of the *Star Tribune*, Dec. 5, 2012)

So, all we have to do is manage to scrounge together \$162,000 and we can all be happy! Forget being wealthy! Certainly if we sell our homes, cars or dip into our 401k plans, we should be able to come up with enough to finally find true bliss and delight! Isn't that better?

Of course, I can't get that pesky little verse from Acts 20:34 out of my head. As Paul bids his friends farewell and departs for his certain death in Rome, he reminds them of the Lord's words: "You're far happier giving than getting." (The Message). I find myself wondering who has it right...the people at Skandia International or Jesus?

My experience tells me Jesus. In fact, as I reflect upon the conversation and

prayerful decision that Jeannie and I reached when we were asked to sacrificially support the Free2Be Grace Campaign, I have to be honest and say I feel excited, blessed, and alive a bit differently. Am I happier? I'm not sure, as we've recently faced costly repair bills to our hot water heater, furnace, and cars. What I'm probably feeling is more like contentment or joy, which I think is closer to the biblical definition of "happy." And as I reflect wider on my life, I believe that I am happiest giving...to God, my children, Jeannie, and to those in need. What's more, the happiness I get from getting seems to be so "short-lived."

As we gathered this month for the "kick off" Event at Majestic Oaks on January 13 and started a year of sacrificial "giving," I hope you felt excited, joyful, blessed, and yes, happy! For we celebrated that God is doing some great things at our church! And now in our Free2Be Grace campaign, he is giving us a chance to reflect upon his blessings as he invites us to give for a great future at Grace. And my hope for the year is found in this truth – it is better to give than get!

The last few months have been an exciting time at Grace! In October, we held 18 Focus Group meetings and presented the God-given vision our leadership has been pursuing, which began with Focus 20/20. During this time we had 184 people attend representing 139 or 25% of the church families. We were able to engage and receive passionate feedback from a broad spectrum of Grace. For those who attended and completed a survey, 83% were in strong support of a campaign to help meet the needs identified. In addition, 116 people were willing to volunteer to help with a campaign. It was a time for us to ask people to join leadership and begin praying for the journey ahead of us. Your response was truly inspirational!

In November, we formed a Steering committee for the **Free 2B Grace Campaign**. On that team, we have 13 committed leaders who began the process of initiating a campaign to help remove the roadblocks that are preventing us from reaching the vision before us in order *to be a ministry of Grace in the Heart of Andover...and beyond!*

As reflected by our core value of weConnect, we have been challenged to reach out to every family within the Grace community – yes all 570 families! In preparation for the kick-off event in January, we have taken steps to meet that goal by connecting with a number of families. Our heartfelt appreciation goes out to those who have already accepted the invitation to meet individually with the **Free 2B Grace** volunteers by engaging in conversation about the future of the church, praying along side the church leadership, and prayerfully considering a sacrificial gift to help us meet the vision before us.

In the days and weeks following our **Free 2B Grace Kickoff Event**, we would ask that you be open, and warmly welcome a visit from fellow members of the Grace family, as we seek to strengthen relationships and connections here at Grace.

May the example provided by leaders at Grace inspire us all with dreams and possibilities of future mission and ministry that we cannot conceive of right now. May the Spirit shape and grow us as we ponder the love God has shown us in the sacrifice of Jesus.

We will hold our Annual Budget Meeting on January 22nd @ 7:00 PM. At this meeting, we will provide a financial update and share the proposed budget for 2013. This will be followed by the Congregational Meetings (at the end of each service) on January 26th and 27th. Please join us as we continue our journey in 2013.

Outreach Ministries:

Celebrating God's Grace! Outreach Ministries – 2012 In Review

God's grace is truly amazing and transforming! As God's love and forgiveness sinks into our hearts and minds, we are amazed . . . then transformed. And together, we are empowered to serve God and his people, striving to live out our mission to be *"a ministry of grace in the heart of Andover."*

Here are highlights of the many outreach ministries that YOU, the Grace family, have invested in during the past year. Praise God for His Spirit working in and through us! Praise God for your tireless efforts and servant's hearts!

Outreach to people locally:

Faith & Community Partnership with Sand Creek Elementary School – Our church is connecting with Sand Creek Elementary School to help meet the needs of local children and families. Grace volunteers donated bike helmets, quilts, food and gas cards, and an abundance of Christmas gifts this year.

Family Promise of Anoka County – Grace hosted Family Promise six different weeks during 2012, using the time and talents of over 350 volunteers to provide caring hospitality for local families experiencing homelessness. Also, many hours were invested in helping move the Day Center.

Family Table Meal – Faithful volunteers continued cooking & serving a complimentary meal on the third Sunday of each month, feeding over 900 people in our local community.

Habitat for Humanity – 14 volunteers from Grace served at a Habitat work site in Fridley, MN last August. Even in the heat of the summer, this energetic team found joy in serving!

Grace Quilters – More than 20 volunteers create beautiful quilts each Wednesday morning. In 2012, over 300 quilts were given to ministries, such as Hospice, Alexander House and Crisis Nursery.

May All Be Fed food shelf – Countless volunteers donated an abundance of non-perishable food items. Our food shelf supported over 120 families in our community this year. Also, Grace collected and donated over 750 pounds of food to the local ACBC food shelf.

Our Savior's Shelter – Grace volunteers continued to serve a monthly meal at this transitional housing shelter in Minneapolis, ministering to so many, and involving over 60 Grace volunteers.

Prayer Shawl Ministry – Volunteers weave prayers into the knitting and crocheting, then delivered nearly 50 shawls and lap blankets to those who were ill or home bound.

Hospitality for Funerals - Countless volunteers baked and prepared food, then many others served the funeral lunches hosted here at Grace. What a tangible way to serve God's grace!

Sleep Out for Homelessness – 25 youth and adults from Grace participated in this city wide event in October, and our team raised over \$900 for Project Home outreach ministries in St. Paul.

Outreach to people globally :

Youth Mission Trip to Milwaukee – Eight youth & three adults went on this summer mission trip, sharing God’s grace by painting homes, serving in soup kitchens, and helping in the inner city.

Adult Mission Trip to Haiti – 17 adults journeyed to Haiti in July to build playgrounds and chicken coops, but more importantly to build relationships with God’s people in Haiti. More mission trips to Haiti are planned for the future in partnership with World Wide Village ministries.

Feed My Starving Children – Over 900 volunteers from Grace packed 403,000 meals at FMSC in 2012, which will feed 1,140 kids a life-saving meal each day for an entire year. Also, we coordinated efforts with area Lutheran churches on two weekends, and together we packed an additional 190,000 meals.

Operation Christmas Child – Grace collected 374 shoe boxes which were delivered around the world, and 12 volunteers from Grace served at the OCC Distribution Warehouse.

30 Hour Famine – Many students and adults participated in this hunger awareness event in March, and collected over \$2,000 for World Vision ministries.

Water Well built in Rakai, Uganda - Generous financial donation of \$4,000 from Grace funded a second water tank at a secondary school in Uganda. This tank provides clean water in a safe location for hundreds of students through African Children Today ministries.

ELCA National Convention - Six high school students from Grace attended this event in New Orleans, and they served in various community outreach ministries during the week.

Additional Generosity:

Grace Bazaar - Countless volunteers raised funds by hosting this holiday craft and food bazaar, with proceeds being donated to a variety of outreach ministries.

Noisy Offerings each week - Over \$18,000 was given this year. Then all funds were sent outside the walls of Grace, to meet the needs of individuals and charity organizations, both locally and globally.

*Look around right now;

As I digested this with my daughter, an awareness slowly came over me in a way that reframed my thoughts on stewardship far beyond simply material things. I was taken with a very literal reading of this blessing. In the scanning of my immediate surroundings, it became very clear to me that nothing in the room could hold a candle to the value I place on the one sitting closest to me. I was struck by my profound sense that material things can come and go, but the people closest to us, our sons and daughters, are invaluable and far beyond the calculations of material worth.

On June 7, 2007, my older brother Jonathan passed away after an unsuccessful heart surgery at age 41. In the unwelcome void of muted voices, sorrowing spirits and the darkened days that followed, my parents would find the strength and courage to speak. What they said surprised me, yet it probably should not have. They are people of deep faith. What I learned from them is that my life, and the life of my siblings, have long been seen as a part of their stewardship journey, as our parents.

In a thank you letter they sent out following Jonathan's funeral, they voiced their sincere gratitude to friends and family who had held us all in prayer during the difficult days of grief and loss following Jon's death.

Here is a small portion of that letter:

Before Jon was born, Rachel and I dedicated him to the Lord. In Holy Baptism, he entered into the Kingdom of God. All our lives, Rachel and I have believed that our children are gifts from God and belong to God. Now we give Jonathan back to God with thanksgiving for 41 years of love and joy. This does not mean that our hearts aren't broken and that many tears aren't being shed. Right now, there is a big hole in our hearts. As I lean against the kitchen counter top in these early hours of the morning, I give thanks for a couple of things. First, I thank God for my brother Jon. I miss him every day, and pray that we can hug or wrestle or both just one more time. Secondly, I give thanks for my parents and this stewardship lesson. It is a lesson, today, that brings a junior high daughter and her dad a step closer to understanding the vastness of stewardship, the uncertainties of each moment and the gift of God-inspired perspective. These coming weeks will bring an avalanche of holiday advertisements, mostly aimed at my daughter's demographic of tweens and teens. In spite of this, we have the opportunity to look around, recognize that it all belongs to God, and act according to the grace that has been freely given to us by God.

Wherever you are right now, I invite you to look around at the people, places and things in your midst. You know what? It all belongs to God. May we steward these things, places, and yes, especially the people and relationships with the same abundance in which they were given to us.
