Getting to the Heart of Lent

Lent...it's something we always do at church. It is forty days of preparing for our celebration of Easter. It's a time of spiritual growth and challenge...a time of the year when we talk about Jesus' suffering and death. Finally, Lent gets to the heart of our faith by reminding us of our God who gives everything, including his own Son, in order to rescue and redeem his world.

There are four basic elements to our celebration of Lent at Grace. Each one is designed to help us experience the wonder of the lengths that God will go to in order to pursue us with his love.

Weekend Worship Services

This year our Lent theme is COVENANT: The Pursuit of God.

Each of our weekend worship services will focus on an Old Testament story about God reaching out to make a promise of healing, restoration, love and forgiveness to his people. We will hear a story of some familiar Biblical people: Noah, Abraham, Moses, and Jeremiah – normal everyday people who God pursues with his promise of love, forgiveness, and hope. These stories will serve as the prism to focus our hearts upon the suffering, death and resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ.

Stewardship & Men's Ministries:

One of the most difficult things a congregation can face is the

departure of one of its pastors.

Regardless of the length of time they have served or the reasons behind their goodbyes, a change of pastors means the congregation must deal with the issues that accompany endings. These times of transition can be filled with grief, anxiety, confusion and a sense of being aimlessly adrift. But endings also bring with them new beginnings and a chance to experience God's love and grace in new and unexpected ways.

It is with great joy that I join you here at Grace to share your ministry during this journey of transition. Though there will be the need to grieve the absence of Pastor Chris's presence in your daily lives, and there may be some level of anxiety for some of you, the visioning and planning that the leadership of Grace has been faithfully working on for the last few years will be invaluable as we navigate these waters of transition together.

Some of the specifics may change over time but my main areas of responsibility, beyond the usual pastoral duties, will be stewardship, men's ministries, and pastoral care. I have a strong background working with small groups, pastoral care and counseling. My internship year at Luther Seminary was spent as a chaplain for North Memorial Medical Center. I also spent the first three years after my 1994 seminary graduation working as an LSS chaplain at North Ridge Care center in New Hope. In 1997 I was called to Lord of Life Lutheran Church in Maple Grove where I served as their Pastor of Congregational Care and Outreach for 9 years. In 1996 I received training as an intentional interim pastor and have served in 4 other interim settings. Though I really love the work of interim ministry, it is hard to have to say goodbye to the people you have served alongside and come to love during an interim.

It is great to be serving a congregation in my own community! I grew up in Coon Rapids and live

just a block from my childhood home with my husband Ron and our spoiled Bichon named Hank. Both Ron and I graduated from Coon Rapids High School, as did our children. My oldest son Ryan lives in St. Paul Park and works in the stucco/ construction industry. He will be marrying Suzanne Stangeland this November in Hawaii! daughter Kara works with her dad in our family owned business in Blaine called The Dance Studio, which is home to the award winning Northern Force Dance Company. She is married to Kyle Bode, a St. Paul firefighter and paramedic who is currently deployed to Oman. They are parents to the cutest and most intelligent grandchildren in the history of the world; Kale 21 months and Kenley 6 months. They live in Blaine. My youngest son, Digger, was married this past June to the beautiful Lindsay Draayer and coaches football at the University of St. Thomas in St. Paul. Lindsay does occupational therapy and rehab at Gillette Children's Healthcare in Burnsville and they own a home in south Minneapolis.

Before having a family and entering the ministry I received my nursing degree from Anoka Ramsey Community College and worked as an orthopedic RN at Hennepin County Medical Center in Minneapolis. I love reading, photography, knitting, sewing, laughing and slapping on a tool belt to fix or build anything! I think my strongest gift as a Christian leader is my joy in being a child of God and my desire to share that joy and the good news of Christ with the world. I look forward to this time with you and I can't wait to discover what God has planned for the future of Grace!

A Note from the Church Administrator

Thank you for your vote of confidence as we submitted the 2012 Annual

Budget for approval! As we mentioned in the January Annual Budget hearing, after prayerful discernment the budget was our attempt to put on paper the financial costs related to the hopes and dreams of the Staff and Leadership here at Grace.

The approved 2012 Budget holds great promise as well as an increased commitment from Staff, Leadership, and Congregation. Here is a recap of some of the Capital and Missional Goals that were shared:

- We would like to build contributions to the Capital fund to a minimum of \$10,066 per month allowing us to: continue to pay our mortgage on time, begin a Capital Campaign in the Spring of 2013, and maintain our Capital Fund balance.
- Continue to emphasize spiritual growth and serving beyond our walls through strengthening and growing our current ministries.
- Fill 2 open positions so our present staff will not have to wear so many different hats. 1) Director of Children, Youth & Family and 2) Communications Specialist.
- Increase our Benevolence by 0.5% as we strive to reach 10% in four years.
- Host another Spiritual Renewal event this fall.
- Continue improvements to the computer environment.
- Pay back the remaining \$6,000 to the Capital Fund.

As a Staff, we will continue to be fiscally responsible by adjusting our spending according to the gifts we receive. We are beginning to prepare for our Stewardship Sermon Series in April in order to bolster the spiritual growth that was initiated through the "Keep It Simple" Campaign in 2011.

Please take the time to prayerfully discern your part in helping us attain our 2012 Goals. We look forward to serving with you in order to reach the goals God has laid before us!

Your old sneakers are worth more than you think!



PLEASE bring your old sneakers to Grace! Your used tennis shoes will be reused as affordable footwear for people in need around the world, plus it saves the landfills from being polluted with those rubber soles that do not decompose. And in addition, your donated sneakers will help raise funds to fight hunger.

Rum River Elementary School is taking the GreenSneakers EcoChallenge for Education in recognition of Earth Day this year. The goal is to gather 3,000 pairs of used sneakers to raise funds for a school program to fight world hunger. GreenSneakers will pay 50 cents per pound and then shoes are distributed as affordable footwear in some of the neediest countries. Shoes are also given to agencies handling disaster and humanitarian relief efforts.

The money raised will fund the event, Rum River Against Hunger, to be held Friday, April 27, 2012. The organization, Impact Lives, will come to Rum River and set up stations so students can pack meals that will feed hungry children around the world. This is the fourth year Rum River has participated in this event and the students have truly become aware of world hunger through this program.


Join us on Sunday nights, from March 4th—April 29th for SundayEvenings@Grace from 5:00pm-7:30pm

Small group discussion is a huge part of our learning experience. You can either sign up as a small group, or sign up as an individual and we'll connect you with a small group.



Family Promise is a simple, highly effective community outreach to families in life circumstances which finds them temporarily without a home. The Family Promise guests spend their days at the Day Center located at 10341 lbis Street in Coon Rapids, using community resources to connect to jobs, permanent housing, counseling services, etc. Then safe and secure overnight shelter, as well as nutritious meals, are provided through local churches and faithful volunteers each evening.

Youth Happenings:



Hunger: It isn't a statistic—it's someone's daughter, sister or brother...

Fact: A child dies from hunger related causes every 8 to 12 seconds. During March, our high school youth will be collecting pledges for their participation in the <u>World Vision 30 Hour Famine</u> which will be held on March 23rd and 24th.

Fact: Globally, 925 million people are hungry. During the famine our youth will go without food for 30 hours and participate in activities that will help them understand the effects of poverty and how we can partner with what God is doing to help the children that are living in these conditions.

Fact: The poor spend most of their money trying not to starve.

Every \$30 that we raise, will feed and care for a child for a month. In addition to raising funds for World Vision, we will be serving people in need in our community as well. You can support our youth and help us to save children's lives by pledging our youth. Our youth will be available after the services beginning Sunday, March 4th, or you can pledge our group online at 30hourfamine.org where you can find additional information about the work that World Vision is doing to help children. We can do our part to stop hunger!

March is Minnesota Food Share Month.

Did you know that we have a food shelf here at Grace? We call it

"May All Be Fed Food Pantry"

We are an emergency food shelf and we serve on average, approximately 12 families a month. We have wonderful volunteers who pre-bag, donated groceries, and each family we serve receives 3 grocery bags filled with food.

Last year our congregation was so very generous! We stocked our shelves here at Grace and we took hundreds of pounds of food to the ACBC food shelf in Anoka! Thank you so much!

The month of March, we will again be handing out grocery bags for you to take home and fill with non-perishable food items so that we can re-stock our shelves and help ACBC in Anoka re-stock theirs.

Hunger in Minnesota has doubled in the last five years. 10 percent of residents in Minnesota do not know where their next meal is coming from. 40 percent of those seeking emergency hunger relief are children under the age of 18.
