

It's Time to Climb the Mountains! Grace's Vacation Bible School Starts on June 10

Hey Grace Kids! It's time to get your hiking boots on to climb up into the mountains! Are you ready? Do you have your backpack ready? Will you want a compass or a hat? Oh...you can't forget your hiking stick and your map. The Children's Ministry at Grace Lutheran Church is heading for the high and mighty mountains in our "Tell It on the Mountain" 2013 Vacation Bible School and we want you to come and enjoy all the fun!

It's not too early to think about our trip to the mighty Mountains of God on June 10-14th. Even though it's the first full week after school is out, it's coming up fast. So we're working hard now to get things ready: we are preparing Bible lessons, planning crafts, organizing games and cooking up some of the best snacks we've ever served at VBS!

What Will Vacation Bible School Be Like?

It is our prayer that God's message of salvation through Jesus, our Savior and Lord will be something our kids will want to shout out and share from the mountaintops to the four corners of our world!

Pastor Mark's Remarks:



Running for the Finish Line

I admire my twin sons! I am so proud they have thrown themselves into

their college sports, and are driven to do their very best both academically and athletically! Kurt is part of the running team at Luther College in Decorah, IA. Kyle is skiing with the Nordic Team at St. Scholastica in Duluth. Both of them are really "into it!" They constantly train. They carefully watch their diets. They put aside money for equipment or special clothing. They travel to certain parts of the country to "run" or "ski." And they are deeply bonded to their team and the coaches. They love their sports!

Recently I was able to watch Kurt run at a big meet at Hamline University in St. Paul. WOW! Talk about determination. As I watched him and the many other athletes from the colleges in the Midwest, I was so impressed! Of course, I watched my son the most! I could see his resolve in his face! I watched the muscles etched out in his legs as he ran past. He was there to run his absolute best. I think he did!

During the race, I kept thinking of a verse from the Book of Hebrews: "Let us run with perseverance the race that is set before us, looking to Jesus, the pioneer and perfector of our faith." It's a verse I remember when I am feeling tired, bored, or distracted from those things I know I need to do. I find I can't complain about too much when I think of Jesus who "endured the cross, disregarding its shame, and has taken his seat at the right hand of the throne of God" (Heb. 12: 1b-2)

I watched Kurt and the other runners looking toward the finish line...talk about perseverance! They hardly saw anything else but the finish line.

I can tell you, few slowed down or faltered at the end. They kept running until they passed the finish line.

We're now getting to the end of the ministry year. There's just a few more weeks to go before SONday School, Catechism Classes and the regular worship schedule comes to an end. We have had a great year of worship asking the question: "Where Do We Fit?" in God's plan of salvation! Frankly, I have loved remembering the great stories of the Bible in a sequential way! But, as we come close to the end, I wonder if we might be tempted to "slow down" or even stop in the "race that is set before us!" After such a long year and cold winter, we may be just itching to get out and enjoy the good weather and all the rest of the spring tasks we face!

So before we do, let's remember that verse from Hebrews: "Let us run with perseverance the race that is set before us," as we dig in for a second (or third!) wind to finish strong and fast! Let's take a lesson from those runners to keep our focus and determination to run to the end. And I believe no matter when we pass the finish line, we will all be winners!

Pastor Steve's Remarks: Confirmation Time!

This month we get to witness another important moment in the journey of our congregation. I've had the privilege of walking alongside a wonderful group of people this year, as more than thirty high school students and their mentors have gone through the **Own Your Faith** process. These dedicated students have met monthly with an adult mentor, have participated in our high school Dojo, and are now ready to make a big step into adulthood.

This journey began fifteen years ago—for most of them—as their parents brought them to the baptismal font to experience the grace of God in the cleansing power of the Holy Spirit. At those waters, their parents and families committed to raise them in the community of faith and teach them the love of God, through Jesus. They've been instructed by their parents, by SONday school teachers, by Catechism leaders, and Own Your Faith mentors. All the decisions have been made for them, and they have been encouraged and led at every step.

Now, on May 19th, these young adults will stand before the congregation and say, "I believe..." with their own voices. They will step out of childhood and begin to make choices based upon their own relationship with God, as the Holy Spirit leads and prompts them.

I invite all of us to take time to pray for these students. Pray that this would be more than a ritual, but that the ritual would be dripping with meaning, and would help shape their imaginations to dream what God can do in and through them in adulthood. Pray that they would feel welcomed in adult spaces and would find meaningful ways to use their gifts and grow deeper in their faith, as they progress through high school. Finally, pray that this would be a time when all of us, young and old, affirm our baptismal identity in the powerful, saving grace of God, through Jesus, and in the power of the Holy Spirit.

Again, I count it a privilege to be able to work with these young adults. I can't wait to see what God will do in and through their lives in the coming years!

Church Administrator: Ralph Holbrook

Wow! What an incredible blessing we experienced during Holy Week. From Palm Sunday to our Easter Celebration of our Resurrected Lord, we were able to take time to reflect and experience a special week in the life of our church.

We were able to share *Grace* with 2,766 people in our community. This includes the 1,500 who attended on Easter Sunday. Throughout the Lent Season, the faithful stewards in our church gave over \$18,400. For Holy Week the staff prepared: 11 services, multiple sermons, 2800+ bulletins, almost 500 power point slides, special music, an Easter Egg hunt with 135 children, and much more. We are taking note of wonderful growth and see this as a tremendous sign of encouragement here at Grace.

Our sincere appreciation goes out to the many volunteers who: prepared our facility and grounds for Holy Week; offered their talents through music, art, drama, and readings; served during the services; and much more. It is great to be part of such a strong body of believers!

We continue to make wonderful strides in our *Free 2B Grace Campaign*. So far, 213 (39.0%)of the Grace families have been contacted by 25 volunteers from the *Free 2B Grace Team*. To date, 107 (19.8%) of the Grace families have prayerfully considered and sacrificially pledged over \$1,033,315 above and beyond their regular giving while many others continue to be in prayer. These are incredible metrics to celebrate that match up with our Core Values of *weConnect, and weEquip, weGrow*!

Our heartfelt appreciation goes out to those who have already accepted the invitation to meet individually with the Free 2B Grace volunteers by engaging in conversation about the future of the church, praying along side the church leadership, and prayerfully considering a sacrificial gift to help meet the vision before us. If you have not been contacted yet, please know the team continues to work hard to reach all the families here at Grace.

Just as savings build slowly over time in our personal finances, the funds will build slowly here at Grace *over the next five years*. This means, in time, we will be able to begin work on some of the safety and deterioration projects at Grace.

While we would like to fix everything all at one time, we are taking a conservative approach and will fix items like the sidewalk, roof, and tuck pointing as funds become available. Currently, we are working with several companies to get updated bids on these three important items.

We will continue to keep you updated as we progress with the *Free 2B Grace Campaign*. Again, thank you Grace Family for your support!



Here is a snapshot of our Income and Expenses through the first quarter (March 31st). **Mission** (**Operational**) **Budget:** We are slightly ahead in receipts through the first quarter when compared to 2012. Our expenses are up mainly due to the abundance of snow this year and the replacement of our failed voice mail system. **Capital Budget:** Giving to the capital mortgage is flat compared to last year. Thanks to the Free 2B Grace Campaign, we are beginning to turn the corner and are slowly building the fund back up. Monies pledged are gradually starting to be received. **Overall:** Our outlook is very positive for 2013.

According to the Grace Lutheran roster, there are 86 senior members at the present time, which is represented by 68 couples and 18 singles.

Due to the extended winter, the property team has been confined to working on indoor projects. If

the snow ever melts, we can begin working on outdoor maintenance tasks. I hope the snow melts soon, the longer it takes, the more things Ralph finds to add to the list. One member of our team spends his free time volunteering at the Anoka County Brotherhood Council Food Shelf. Other team members are helping by driving the bus for our Family Promise host week.

Graceful senior members are also cooking and serving meals during our host week for Family Promise. Once a month some of these same people are helping to serve dinner at Family Table. When tragedy strikes members of Grace, the Graceful Seniors are there to provide refreshments and fellowship for grieving families.

On a rotating basis, seven of our senior men have voluntarily transported one of our Grace members to the U of M Hospital for daily radiation treatments. The senior men are working on a plan for a fishing trip to Lake Mille Lacs sometime in early June. Keep this in your mind and stay tuned for further information.

On the third Tuesday of each month, Pastor Gene Heglund leads the "Senior breakfast" in a Biblically-related study at the Farmstead in Andover. The current charge for a delicious breakfast buffet served by the Farmstead staff is \$6.50. The meeting begins at 8:30am and is usually completed by 9:45am. Reservations need to be made for the breakfast. If you are interested in joining us, please call the church office at 763-421-6520. In addition, this group attends occasional plays at Lyric Arts as a group and usually meets at Billy's for brunch the Sunday of the play. "Hairspray" is on the schedule for August.



Grace Music Academy:

Saying "Goodbye" and "Hello!"

Sometimes it's challenging to say "Goodbye" to dear friends and longtime neighbors. We realize that over the years they have become such an important part of our lives, we can't imagine what our lives might be like without them close by. Nonetheless, situations change, jobs end, retirements come, and we find it necessary to say, "Goodbye."

While a "Goodbye" might be difficult, often it is followed by a wonderful "Hello" as we welcome new neighbors, co-workers, new hires, and circumstances in our lives! Surprisingly we can find our lives don't diminish with loss, but become richer with the changes! Such is life at our church as we say "Good bye" to the Grace Music Academy and "Hello" to our new Parish Nurse Ministry.

We find it challenging to say "Goodbye" to the music ministry we developed and tried to sustain for nearly eight years. In the Fall of 2005, the music academy began as a way for Grace to enrich its overall music ministries, grow our community outreach by providing musical lessons and special music events, and be a way to grow faith in our students, as teachers shared how their faith empowered their playing. We knew the first couple of years the church would financially support this emerging ministry 100 percent, but it was our hope that after a few years, the Academy would be strong and financially stable with a projected 90 students. (We based our original business model on the success of Grace's Golden Rule Daycare and other church music academies in the twin cities.) However, we have not seen this happen, and as a result the Vision Board and leadership came to the difficult decision to close the academy.

As we say "Goodbye" to this wonderful music ministry, we must pause and give thanks for all the many blessings we have received! We appreciate the wonderful administrators and staff members who helped lead this ministry: Marcelo and Margareth Urias, Scott Stivers, Denise Redman, and Jonathan Orwig. We are grateful for the many teachers who have served faithfully and touched the lives of students. In order for a person to be spiritually fit, they have to be men-

tally, emotionally, spiritually and physically healthy. A parish nurse is called and committed to promote abundant life - a balance between all four needs. This ministry is grounded in the tradition of the church, "to preach the kingdom of God and to heal" (Luke 9:2).

What will our Parish Nurse Ministry at Grace look like? A Parish nurse works with members of a church in many ways:

- Visits members in homes, care centers or hospitals
- Talks with members on health-related issues
- Assists in obtaining needed health services
- Helps members understand the relationship between body, mind and spirit
- Assists in adapting important lifestyle changes
- Promotes wellness through education and activities
- Provides basic health screenings
- Develops support groups within the faith community
- Coordinates congregational volunteers

We are grateful that both Lily and Lori have stepped forward to volunteer their time to begin this ministry. They plan to work 25 hours a month on an unpaid basis because they are so passionate about growing healthy and spiritually fit people at Grace. One of their first steps will be to find people who would like to serve on a Wellness Ministry Team and help develop the programs. If you are interested, please call the church office to volunteer.

This is an exciting new ministry at Grace. It will bring a whole new dimension to spiritual growth at our church. God is good and continues to grow us as a ministry of Grace. Once again we have reason to celebrate - As we say "Goodbye" we also say, "Hello!"


Grace 2Haiti:

More than Enough!



Paul asks the Christians at Corinth to give an offering for the Christian people in Jerusalem who are living in extreme poverty. In this portion of the appeal he makes a case for a generous response.

2 Corinthians 9:6-9 (CAV)
"Remember that the person who

sows few seeds will have a small crop; the one who sows many seeds will have a large crop. You should each give, then, as you have decided, not with regret or out of a sense of duty; for God loves the one who gives gladly. And God is able to give you more than you need, so that you will always have all you need for yourselves and more than enough for every good cause. As the scripture says: "He gives generously to the needy; his kindness lasts forever."

I was on a basketball team in Junior High. During one game, Howard Anderson who at 5'5" (our big man) was in the game as our center. During a timeout the coach said, "Strock, you take Howard's place." Duane Strock, 4'4", was astonished and said, "Who me, take Howard's place?"

When people are asked to stretch in their giving, there are voices that cry out:

- "Who me?"
- "Who us?"
- "We are not talented enough."
- "We are too poor."
- "We do not have the leadership."
- "We are too old or too young."
- "We can't meet the budget we have."
- "If only we had more people."
- "If only we have more youth."
- "If only we could get some rich and talented members in our congregation."

I have heard these response and many similar ones in congregations that worship 30 and in those who worship 5,000. These are the voices of those whose mindset has bought into the myth of scarcity. This myth generates fear and defines people as deficient.

In response to this, here is what I believe. First, regardless of your size or your context, God has given you and your church opportunities to join

Jesus in loving the world. You are called to continue the work that Jesus began. God expects that the church will love mercy, do justly and walk humbly. Jesus states that we are to "love God" and to "love our neighbor" as ourselves and Jesus commissions us to make disciples.

Every person is called by God to enter into mission locally and globally. If you don't know what that might be for you, you need to prayerfully identify it, write it down, pray about it, talk about it and intentionally commit yourselves to meet it. In Paul's letter, he offers the opportunity to respond to the needs of the impoverished Christians in Jerusalem.

Second, God provides all you need to do what God calls you to do. You have more than enough talent, leadership, imagination and money available. Make an effort to encourage, discover and identify the assets God has entrusted to your care. God is extravagant with you. You can do far more than you ask or imagine.

A more than enough perspective is biblical. It is rooted in the confidence that God will provide. A missional congregation trusts God and generously sows seeds of love in the world.

Recall what Paul wrote:

- 1. The more seeds you sow the greater the harvest. That is common sense.
- 2.God desires you to be a joyful giver. How do you know the joy of giving unless you give? God who is the ultimate giver finds great joy in giving.
- 3. And here is the clincher: "God is able to give you more than you need, so that you will always have all you need for yourselves and more than enough for every good cause".

I invite you to live in God's promises. I invite you to choose a ministry which calls upon the use of the gifts that have been entrusted to you See yourselves from God's perspective not your own.




