# Everything I Ever Needed to Know, I Learned in Vacation Bible School!



I was so in love with Miss Mitchell, my 1<sup>st</sup> grade Vacation Bible School Teacher. I was convinced she was an angel sent from heaven. Sweet, beautiful, kind...I dreamt the twenty-some

year age difference would not matter and she would willingly wait for me to grow up so we could marry. Miss Mitchell was that wonderful!! Fortunately for me, she didn't wait and I have been blessed with another angel – Jeannie.

But to get back to my story, Miss Mitchell was an important part of my introduction to Vacation Bible School. Since then VBS has always been in my life...first as a student, then as a teacher/administrator, and finally as a pastor. Although there hasn't been another beautiful teacher from heaven to fill "Miss Mitchell's" shoes, there have been many other little angels who have shared in VBS throughout the years.

I learned so many important things in VBS! My earliest recollections were the daily trips to a tiny Presbyterian church nestled in an inner city neighborhood of Pittsburgh, PA. My mother saw Vacation Bible School as an important outreach to tell others about the love of Jesus, especially in places where his voice was not always easily heard. Thus she volunteered as the VBS song leader in this poor struggling church in one of the worst parts of the city. My sister Janis and I were the only two white kids in the sea of black African American children, and although we lived far apart and in two different worlds;, at this little church's VBS, we are all one group of excited children. The songs, crafts, flannelboard Bible stories, and exciting missionary stories held us all spell bound as they taught us the most important thing in life - God loves us!

Another important thing I learned was the importance of community. Although I lived so far away from the rest of the kids, I was accepted as one of them. It didn't matter the color of my skin or that I spoke dif-

ferently. I was part of the VBS family and when it came to the final night's program, I proudly stood with the rest of the students to proclaim as loudly as I could sing, our message of God's love. I think this is one of the reasons why I resonate so deeply with our CORE VALUE of connection. I first learned this value at Vacation Bible School.

VBS was fun! I think that's the other important thing I learned about God...it could be fun! Ever since, I have experienced the same joy over and over again. Learning about God doesn't have to be drudgery. No, being with a bunch of kids and learning about Bible stories with singing, crafts, drama, and games can be "cool" and make a great impact on a person's life. This is what I notice so many times at the end of VBS. The kids love it. The staff loves it. The parents love it. And so do I.

So as we begin to prepare for this year's Adventures on Promise Island Vacation Bible School, I can't help but wonder about the child who will be coming to our VBS for the first time. Will he or she have as positive an experience as I did so many years ago? Will they learn everything they need right now? How about for later years in their life? I don't know, but that's what I'm praying for! In the meantime I know that Kim DeVries and the rest of the VBS staff are doing everything they possibly can to make this year's VBS one of our best. Please join me in praying that all of the children will learn how much God loves them and that they are a part of His family, no matter what!

### Stewardship:



#### A word from Pastor Karri:

I'd like a fish sandwich and a large diet coke, I said, "Do you want the filet meal?" a faceless voice asked. "No thanks, I responded, "just the sandwich and the drink." "But if you buy the meal it will cost

less AND you'll get an order of fries too," she continued. "But I don't want any fries," I replied . "Well, you don't have to eat them, but if you get the meal it will be cheaper."

It's not easy trying to be a steward in our world is it? Though it seems like such a minor choice, I realized as this conversation unfolded that it was a perfect example of the challenges we face as we try to live a stewardship lifestyle.

I love McDonalds French fries! But I also know they are not a healthy choice for me, which is why I didn't order them in the first place. If I had gone ahead and purchased the "meal deal" I would have been throwing out food I never intended to eat, just to save money. Or the more likely result would be that I would end up eating them.

On the other hand, the state of our economy has made me much more conscious of how quickly the mindless spending of small amounts of change can quickly add up over time.

We are given conflicting messages from society and the media.

- It is good to be a consumer.
- It is good to recycle.

Throughout each day we are faced with making choices about how we steward what God has entrusted to us. So many of those choices seem insignificant to us, but as a global society we are becoming more and more aware of the difference they do make.

I had the privilege of attending a workshop at the seminary recently entitled *The Art of Hosting Conversations That Matter*. There were almost 50 people in attendance who came from a broad range of backgrounds, cultures, professions, and faith traditions. There were pastors and youth workers, a Native American, several who were Jewish, and those from non churched backgrounds. They work in corporate, non-profit, government and religious environments.

During one of the practice sessions I was able to act as a table host and I brought forward the question: "How do we help develop an understanding of what it means to live a stewardship lifestyle?"

It was astounding to me that regardless of people's backgrounds, jobs, or belief systems, everyone who participated held a deep sense that we are indeed *stewards*.

We have just spent four weeks exploring what difference a life of stewardship can make for us, for our communities, for the world, and for God. As we embrace what it means to live a stewardship lifestyle, there can be times when we feel discouraged or alone. We may ask ourselves, "How can I make any difference?" But we are not alone. We do make a difference! Even if we don't always see it, we can trust that the God of abundance, the God of promise, the God of creation, and the God of love can use all of us to bring healing, wholeness and hope.

May you continue to be in conversation and grow in your life of stewardship and faith!

# A Note from the Church Administrator

Wow! What an incredible blessing we experienced during Holy Week. From Palm Sunday to

our Easter Celebration of our Resurrected Lord, we were able to take time to reflect and experience a special week in the life of our church.

We were able to share the Good News with 2,660 people in our community. This includes the 1,400+ who attended on Easter Sunday. Throughout the Lent Season, the faithful stewards in our church gave over \$23,000. Both attendance and giving were well above expectations and have not been at this level since 2000. In addition, the staff prepared: 8 services, varying sermons, 2600+ bulletins, over 100 power point slides, special music, an Easter Egg hunt with 135 children, and much more. We are taking note of wonderful growth and see this as a tremendous sign of encouragement here at Grace.




# Calling all Beach Bums!

Family Promise: Building Community, Strengthening Lives; May 13-20, 2012

Grace will host Family Promise at our church the week of May 13-20. Grace volunteers will provide warm hospitality and safe shelter for families in Anoka County who have found themselves without a place to stay.

How can you help? Here's a list of various volunteer opportunities:

- Prepare an evening meal for 16 people
- Serve the meal and clean up the kitchen (5 7:30 pm)
- Provide overnight security at the church (8:30pm - 7 am). Yes, you'll get to sleep at church
- Be an Evening Host chat with guests, play games, help with homework, etc. (5 – 9 pm)
- Set up and take down beds
- Donate food supplies for Host Week, such as milk, juice, bread, fruit and snacks.
- Transport guests in the FPAC van (at 7 am or at 5 pm)

What Is It? Family Promise of Anoka County (FPAC) is a network of 16 congregations who provide temporary housing to families without homes. Guests are housed at each host congregation for one week on a rotating basis, moving to a new location in the network each week until they are able to become self-sufficient.

How Does It Work? Grace will provide lodging, meals and caring hospitality five different weeks this year. The FPAC van transports guests to Grace each evening for dinner and an overnight stay at the church. After breakfast, families are returned to the Day Center in Coon Rapids. From there the children can go to school, and parents can go to work, or use the resources at the center to seek employment and future housing.

Volunteer Training will be held from 6:30–8pm Monday, May 7 for all volunteers who would like to be involved in this ministry.

Kids and Youth in who are entering Grade 2-9 in the fall are invited to be a part of <u>Are We</u>


